The SIAC Project in a few worlds

which aims to support youth workers and other professionals working with youths who are at risk of cyberbullying and increase their skills, knowledge and confidence to foster young peoples' resilience and knowledge in using the internet and being safe from cyberbullying.

This will be achieved through different actions and tools, aimed at recognising and responding early and effectively to behaviors that can lead to cyberbullying, learn about new strategies for controlling bullying, and raise awareness among young people of the dangers related to the wrong use of the internet. These include:

- A full curriculum on cyberbullying prevention
- An e-course focused on recognising, preventing and tackling cyberbullying, which will receive Continuous Professional Development (CPD) status
- An e-book on cyberbullying

The first face-to-face meeting in Malta



On 12th October 2021 the SIAC partners met in Malta for the first face-to-face meeting of the project. Although the project started in December 2020, partners had not been able to meet before due to the pandemic.

Partners discussed about the project implementation and also met with local stakeholders, who will play an important role in the next stages of the project.

The state-of-the-art of the project



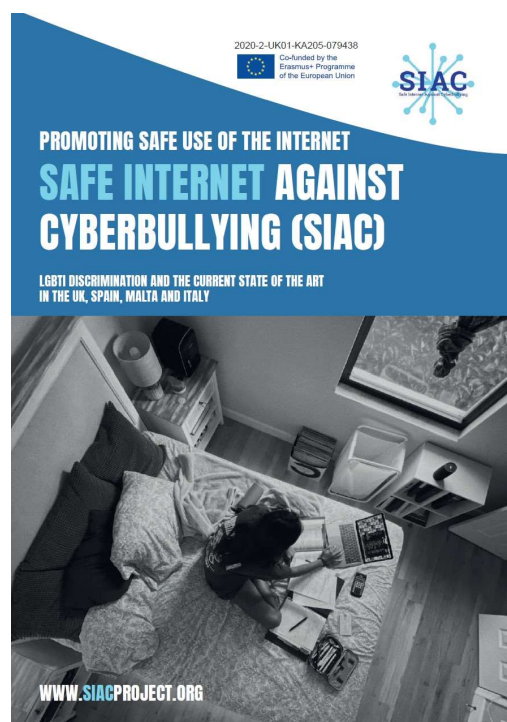
Partners are currently working on the development of the training curriculum, which will be directed at youth workers and professionals working with young people. The curriculum will focus on the following topics:

- Knowledge of the phenomenon of cyberbullying
- Cyberbullying prevention
- Intervention
- Restorative Justice
- Best practices

As soon as the course is ready, it will be published on an e-learning platform and piloted in each partner country with relevant stakeholders.
