Conclusion of the project



The SIAC project reached its end on 30th November 2022. Its conclusion was celebrated with a sense of accomplishment and pride. The project brought together a diverse group of youth organisations, educators and other stakeholders from different countries, who worked together to develop and implement a comprehensive education programme on the prevention and management of cyberbullying.

The project outcomes include interactive workshops and resources such as a training course for youth workers, handbooks and videos, a research on the state-of-the-art of cyberbullying in the participating countries, and an e-book, which were all well-received by the participating organizations and participants taking part in the project activities. The partnership has concluded that the project has been effective in increasing awareness and understanding of cyberbullying among youths.

Overall, the conclusion of the 2-year Erasmus project on cyberbullying was a positive and successful milestone, and the partnership is confident that the outcomes developed will continue to make a meaningful impact in the community.

Final transnational project meeting in London



Partners met for the final transnational project meeting on 24th November 2022. The meeting was held in London and hosted by <u>Kairos Europe</u>.

At the final partners meeting, the team discussed the progress that had been made over the course of the project. The team reported that they had successfully developed and implemented a comprehensive education programme for youth workers and educators, and a good set of resources for stakeholders such as policy makers, youth organisations, schools, and so on.

The team also reviewed other aspects of the project, such as budget, communication, evaluation, final report, and so on. It was acknowledged the contributions of all partners and the collective effort that was fundamental for the achievement of the project results.

Overall, the final partners meeting was a positive and productive review of the project, and the team expressed their intentions to continue to use its results in the years to come.

Multiplier event in the UK



The multiplier event in the UK was part of a day-conference with multiple speakers all speaking around the theme of Preventing violent youth radicalisation, school exclusion, cyberbullying and homelessness. During the event all the partners in the project made a presentation about their involvement in the project and their contribution to the achievement of the results. In addition, other contributions included presentations on: decolonising curriculum and culturally responsive teaching, an evaluation of the effectiveness of applied theatre methods in helping offenders desist from crime, and preventing violence and exclusion through restorative justice.

Multiplier event in Spain





The Multiplier event in Spain was held on 29th November. Two session were held. The first session was held in a school called SAFA Funcadia and the attendees were students, teachers and psychologists. The second event was held in the Colegio Salesiano "Cristo Sacerdote" school, and was attended by teachers and professionals from the school. During both events, there was a presentation of the project and its results and an introduction to cyberbullying followed by discussions about the phenomenon of cyberbullying and its

consequences. Also, practical demonstrations were held to show participants how to register to the platform and participate in the course and download all the course resources.

Multiplier event in Malta



The event was held on 6th October at the De La Salle College in Malta. The event started with a general presentation about cyberbullying, its forms, the parties involved and the vehicles. Subsequently, there was a discussion vulnerable groups and a group work about preventing cyberbullying.

Multiplier event in Italy



The event was held at the Casa Delle Donne del Mediterraneo, in Bari, on 30th November 2022. The event This multiplier event was part of different dissemination events in Bari and close-by cities with the goal to disseminate all the resources developed and available to

young people and professionals could support working with youth at risk of cyberbullying. The event was organised in collaboration with Agedo Puglia, an association of parents, relatives and friends of LGBT people dedicated to providing counselling services to these groups.

The event was attended by youth workers, educators, students, as well as policy makers and other stakeholders.



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
